
Ann Wark—Book Launch Sunday 30th July

Saturday October 27, 1855

'The Archbishop came on board at about 6th.0^M AM. Weighed anchor at about 7th.0^M. Were towed down the Mersey by the tug steamboat Dreadnought which parted from us at 11th.20^M AM as the wind was fair. Fresh breeze blowing.'

These are the opening lines in the journal kept by Myles Athy during his voyage to Sydney, Australia on the vessel *Phoenix* which set sail from Liverpool, England over 161 years ago.

Journal of a voyage to Australia 1855-56 by Myles Athy, a recruit for St Mary's Monastery, Sydney is to be launched on Sunday 30 July, 2017 at 3pm in St James Church. All Parishioners are warmly invited to attend. There will be a sign-up sheet at the back of the church a couple of weeks beforehand for catering purposes.



St Bonaventure joined the order of Franciscans in 1243, and was soon recognised for his intellectual talents. He was sent to study in Paris where he taught and preached for many years. He was a contemporary of St Thomas Aquinas, with whom he defended the mendicant friars against their opponents. In 1257, Bonaventure was elected as head of the Franciscans, and has since been considered the greatest friar minor since St Francis of Assisi himself. He wrote important works on theology, philosophy and mysticism, and was de-

clared a doctor of the church in 1588. He was also regarded for his compassionate and gentle nature and for his accessibility to those who sought him.



NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father
almighty, maker of heaven & earth,
