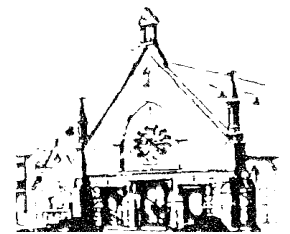

TODAY IS THE CATHOLIC MISSION APPEAL.

Catholic Mission is the Australian agency of the international Pontifical Mission Societies. Locally and globally, they answer the call to love God and love our neighbour, and work to establish the Reign of God through building communities of missionary disciples of Jesus who share their faith by proclaiming the Word, serving people in need, acting for justice and creation, and adopting child-focused development programs. Catholic Mission operates in over 160 countries to support initiatives in 1,100 dioceses, including remote Australia.

Founded in 1822 by a lay single woman named Pauline Jaricot, today Catholic Mission is the Pope's own mission organisation. Catholic people are called to give priority to Catholic Mission as the agency provides essential funding for the Church in Africa, Asia, the Pacific and parts of South America. Internationally Catholic Mission is called the Pontifical Mission Societies or Missio, and historically is known as Propagation of the Faith, Children's Mission and St Peter Apostle.

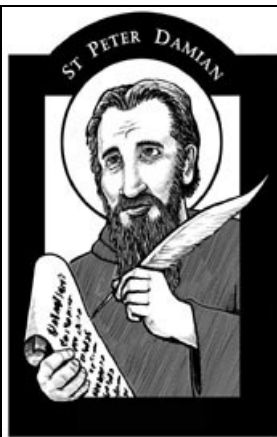

Peter Damian was born to a large but poor Italian family in 1007 AD. He was orphaned at a young age and was mistreated by an older brother. He was eventually cared for and educated by another brother who was an archpriest. He joined a Benedictine monastery where he lived the simple and strict life of a hermit. Peter was made the cardinal bishop of Ostia in 1057 and began many local reforms. He wrote numerous sermons and biographies, and was a strong supporter of church reforms and discipline.

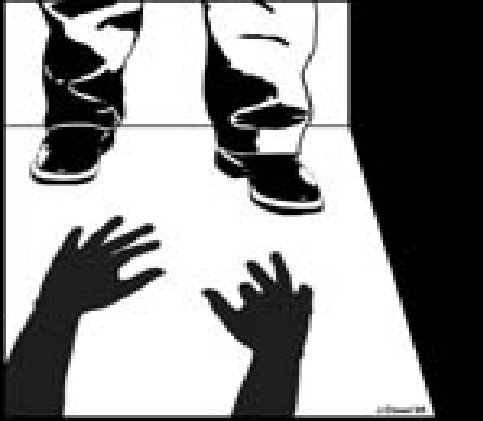

FIRST READING

Leviticus 13:1-2. 44-46

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a
swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on
a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the
skin is to be suspected. The man must
be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one
of the priests who are his sons.
'The man is leprosy: he is unclean. The
priest must declare him unclean; he is
suffering from leprosy of the head.
A man infected with leprosy must wear
his clothing torn and his hair disordered;
he must shield his upper lip and cry,
"Unclean, unclean". As long as the
disease lasts he must be unclean; and
therefore he must live apart; he must
live outside the camp.'

SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 10:31 – 11:1

Whatever you eat, whatever you drink,
whatever you do at all, do it for the
glory of God. Never do anything

just as I try to be helpful to everyone
at all times, not anxious for my own
advantage but for the advantage of
everybody else, so that they may be
saved.

GOSPEL

Mark 1:40-45

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on
his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you
can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him,
Jesus stretched out his hand and
touched him. 'Of course I want to!' he
said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left
him at once and he was cured. Jesus
immediately sent him away and sternly
ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to
anyone, but go and show yourself to
the priest, and make the offering for
your healing prescribed by Moses as
evidence of your recovery.' The man
went away, but then started talking
about it freely and telling the story
everywhere, so that Jesus could no
longer go openly into any town, but
had to stay outside in places where
nobody lived. Even so, people from all
around would come to him.



NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father
almighty, maker of heaven & earth,
of all things visible and invisible. I
believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the Only Begotten Son of God, born
of the Father before all ages. God
from God, Light from Light, true
God from true God, begotten, not
made, consubstantial with the
Father; through him all things were
made. For us men and for our
salvation he came down from
heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was
incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and
became man. For our sake he was
crucified under Pontius Pilate, he
