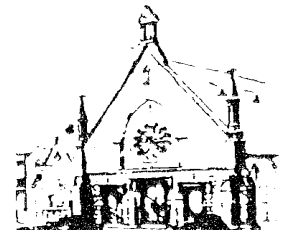

Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

We humans are created into the image of God. If our idea of God is wrong then we can imagine ourselves in a way which is dangerously de-humanising.

If we think of God as solitary Being then we might imagine that the best way of being human is to be solitary, self-sufficient, totally in-dependent of others. However, Jesus Christ revealed a different way for the eyes of faith to see God.

He had a sense of the most intimate communion with 'Abba', Father, and he had such a close relationship with the Holy Spirit that his very breathing on his disciples imparted this Breath of God upon them. The early Church was forced to conclude that Being and Relationship were both fundamentally primordial and true of the Tri-une God, or the Trinity for short.

Now, if we are created into *this* image of God, then our very existence needs to be relational for us to be fully human in this life and the next. To be totally self-absorbed is to consign oneself to a Hellish existence. To be open to communion with God, other human beings and the whole of creation is to enjoy a Heavenly existence.

We can take a moment to pray to thank God for this revelation not granted to, or at least not believed by, other great world religions. We thank Jesus Christ for satisfying our yearning to know the truth about our Creator, and helping us to understand what it is to be fully human. May we recall this every time we dip our fingers in the holy water font on entering a church, remembering our baptism: 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.'

CHRIST EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION ON THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI, SUNDAY 3 JUNE 2018.

Participants will gather at the corner of Pitt St and Martin Place in the CBD at 2:30pm. The procession will follow the Blessed Sacrament through the Sydney CBD, finishing at the St Mary's Cathedral Forecourt with Adoration and Benediction. If you are unable to join us for the Procession, you are more than welcome to join us for Adoration and Benediction from approximately 3:30pm in the St Mary's Cathedral Forecourt. The event will conclude at approximately 4:30pm. The procession will help mark the 200th anniversary of a little known, but most heroic and faith-filled time in the history of the Australian Church. In 1818, the Government forcibly removed the only Catholic priest in Australia, Fr Jeremiah O'Flynn, from Sydney. Fr O'Flynn's last pastoral act was to leave the Blessed Sacrament reserved in a faithful Catholic's home so that the colonists and prisoners could come to adore Christ present there. For two years, the Blessed Sacrament, in this lay Sydney home, was the source and centre of worship and consolation for the priestless Catholics of the Australian colony. Please look for the Books of Life in your parish to write your prayer intentions that will be offered at the end of the procession.

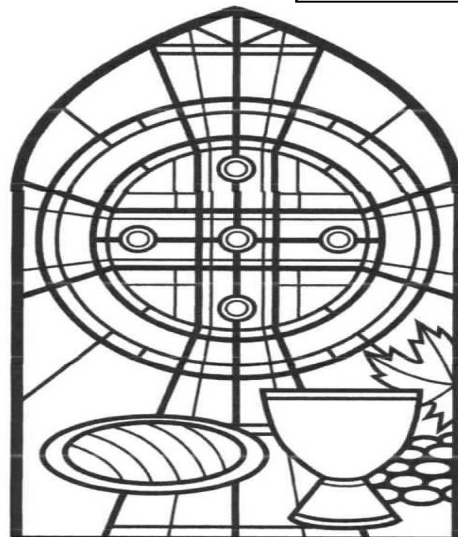
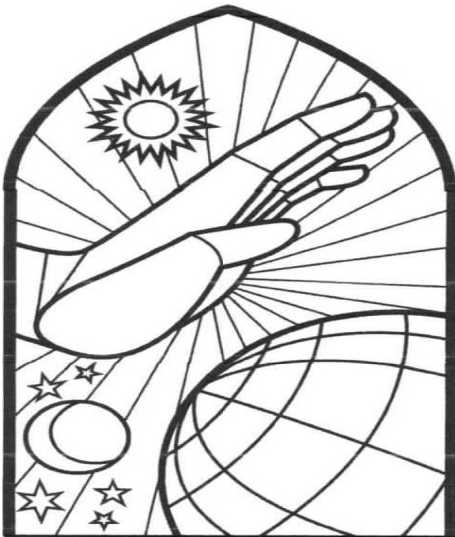

St Boniface was born in c.675 in Devonshire and was educated at a Benedictine monastery.

Ordained a priest at the age of thirty, Boniface became a missionary to Germany and in 722 was consecrated Bishop of Hesse. A popular story of his evangelisation tells of his encounter with a pagan tribe that worshipped the Norse god Thor in the form of an oak tree. Boniface walked up to the ancient tree and cut it down with an axe, then stood on the trunk and said, "How stands your mighty god? My God is stronger than he." This led to widespread conversions and with the timber from the oak, he built a chapel dedicated to St Peter, Prince of the Apostles. He became an Archbishop in 732 and died in 754 after being attacked by a band of pagans while evangelising in Holland.

Moses said to the people: 'Put this

went before you, from the time God
created man on earth: Was there ever a
word so majestic, from one end of
heaven to the other? Was anything ever
heard? Did ever a people hear the voice
of the living God speaking from the heart
of the fire, as you heard it, and remain
alive? Has any god ventured to take to
himself one nation from the midst of
another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war
with mighty hand and outstretched arm,
by fearsome terrors – all this that the
Lord your God did for you before your
eyes in Egypt?

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son
of God. The spirit you received is not

spirit bear united witness that we are
children of God. And if we are children
we are heirs as well: heirs of God and
coheirs with Christ, sharing his
sufferings so as to share his glory.

Matthew 28:16-20

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee,
to the mountain where Jesus had ar-

some hesitated. Jesus came up and
spoke to them. He said, 'All authority
in heaven and on earth has been given
to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of
all the nations; baptise them in the
name of the Father and of the Son and
of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to
observe all the commands I gave you.
And know that I am with you always;
yes, to the end of time.'



NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father
almighty, maker of heaven & earth,
of all things visible and invisible. I
believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the Only Begotten Son of God, born
of the Father before all ages. God
from God, Light from Light, true
God from true God, begotten, not
made, consubstantial with the
