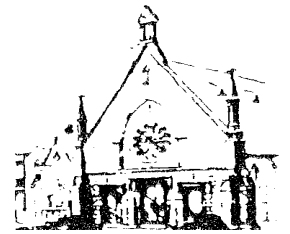

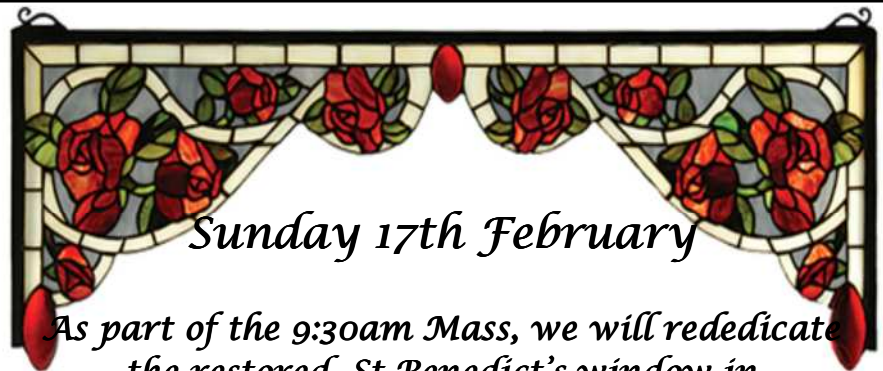

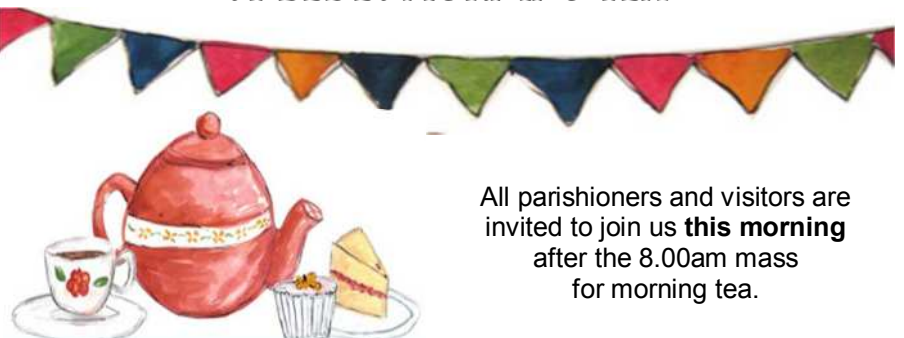

wilderness, a salt land, uninhabited.

'A blessing on the man who puts his

that thrusts its roots to the stream:
when the heat comes it feels no alarm,
its foliage stays green; it has no worries
in a year of drought, and never ceases to
bear fruit.'

SECOND READING**1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20**

If Christ raised from the dead is what
has been preached, how can some of
you be saying that there is no
resurrection of the dead? For if the
dead are not raised, Christ has not been
raised, and if Christ has not been
raised, you are still in your sins. And
what is more serious, all who have died
in Christ have perished.

If our hope in Christ has been for this
life only, we are the most unfortunate
of all people.

But Christ has in fact been raised from
the dead, the first-fruits of all who have
fallen asleep.

GOSPEL**Luke 6:17. 20-26**

Jesus came down with the Twelve and
stopped at a piece of level ground
where there was a large gathering of
his disciples with a great crowd of
people from all parts of Judaea and
from Jerusalem and from the coastal
region of Tyre and Sidon who had come
to hear him and to be cured of their
diseases.

Then fixing his eyes on his disciples he
said:

'How happy are you who are
poor: yours is the kingdom of
God.

Happy you who are hungry now:
you shall be satisfied.

Happy you who weep now:
you shall laugh.

'Happy are you when people hate you,
drive you out, abuse you, denounce
your name as criminal, on account of
the Son of Man. Rejoice when that day
comes and dance for joy, for then your
reward will be great in heaven. This was
the way their ancestors treated the
prophets.

'But alas for you who are rich:
you are having your consolation
now.

Alas for you who have your fill
now: you shall go hungry.

Alas for you who laugh now: you
shall mourn and weep.

'Alas for you when the world speaks
well of you! This was the way their
ancestors treated the false prophets.'

NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father
almighty, maker of heaven & earth,
of all things visible and invisible. I
believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the Only Begotten Son of God, born
of the Father before all ages. God
from God, Light from Light, true
God from true God, begotten, not
made, consubstantial with the
Father; through him all things were
