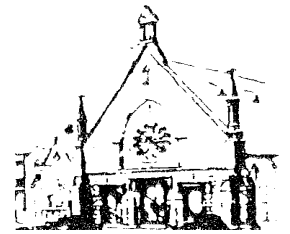

At the entrance to St James and St Bede's Churches, you will find a sheet with the instructions you need to complete the training, the WWCC and the Code of Conduct.



**In seeking to reflect this spirit, an invitation is extended to members of the parish and school community to the following events taking place in St James Church:**


**Sunday 24th February:**

Saul set off and went down to the

their way towards the force, where they  
found Saul asleep inside the camp, his

present the other cheek too; to the  
man who takes your cloak from you,  
do not refuse your tunic. Give to every-

them to treat you. If you love those  
who love you, what thanks can you  
expect? Even sinners love those who  
love them. And if you do good to those  
who do good to you, what thanks can  
you expect? For even sinners do that

whom you hope to receive, what  
thanks can you expect? Even sinners  
lend to sinners to get back the same  
amount. Instead, love your enemies  
and do good, and lend without any  
hope of return. You will have a great  
reward, and you will be sons of the

**NICENE CREED**

I believe in one God, the Father
